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Building Up a Verbal Cue - Diggy Diggy

Most people use verbal cues in their handling systems, but not everyone is adding them with clarity for the dog. Susan demonstrates how she creates clarity for her dogs by teaching and growing the cue "Diggy Diggy" (180-270º turn jump cue) from scratch, so you can use this model to train any cue with your dog.

If you are playing with a youngster, evaluate the strength and capabilities of your puppy to decide whether to progress with the different stages of the game or wait until they are physically and mentally ready, and then progress at a pace that brings confidence to your dog.

Stage 1 ~ Vito Game with Two Cones

Dogs of all ages can play, and this is a great game to start with your puppy, but don't let them associate one scenario with one particular cue. We want them to be able to listen and differentiate many different cues with the same set up.

- Start by brushing up your Vito's Thinking Game with your dog.
- Set up two cones close together with two targets or food bowls, and keep playing the game. Remember not to say anything, just give permission for your dog to get the cookie when you drop it onto the target.
- Gradually move your targets and yourself further away from the cones, and eventually remove the targets.
- Keep your sessions short and end with a game of tug! Remember to film and record keep your sessions.













Stage 2 ~ Moving the Cones Apart

- Warm up with a repetition of the previous stage and then move the cones apart a little to progress.
- Gradually move the cones further apart. Now your dog will have to choose, do they go between the cones or around them? Reinforce the good choice of going around!
- Move the cones further away so your dog does come between them and the reinforcer does not appear. If you notice
 your dog makes fewer mistakes on one side, repeat the one they're better at so you can reinforce a little more, and
 try the other side again. Go back to having the cones closer if you need to and eventually move them apart, up to at
 least three of your strides.









Reinforce your dog for going around the cones, rather than between.
